## Stayman over 1NT

Over a 1NT opening Stayman is a convention to find a better " fit". By responder bidding 2C they are asking opener to bid a 4 card major. NOTE Stayman must only be used when responder has two 4 card majors or 4 and 5 cards in the major suits. With no 4 card major opener bids 2D.

Your partner has opened 1NT with 12-14 points what should you do with these hands -
